In the original article, there was a mistake in **Figure 3**. The wrong graphs were used and they were in the wrong order. The corrected **Figure 3** appears below.

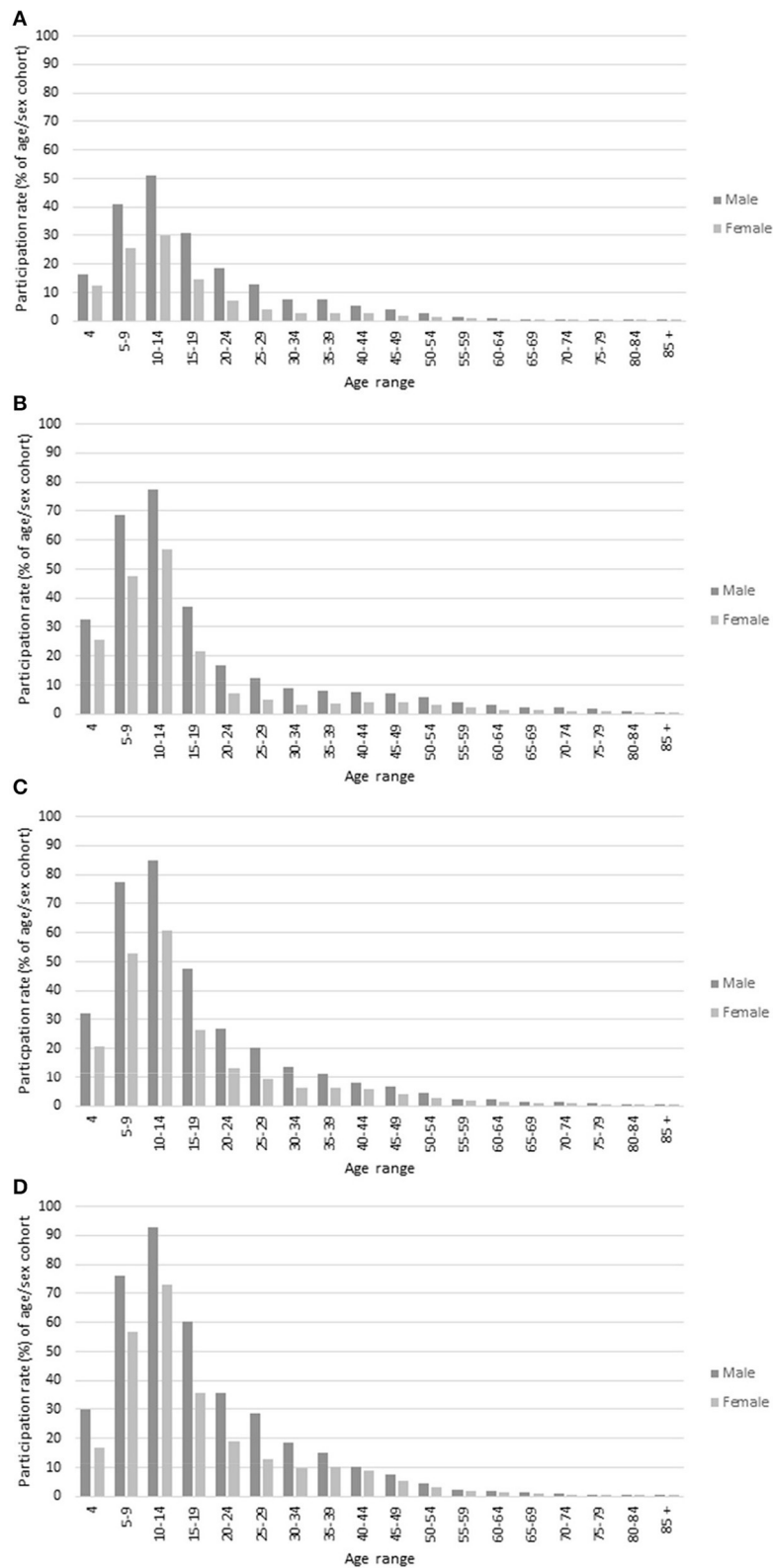
